MINUTES SEPTEMBER 4, 2018

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 7:00 pm by Mayor Casebolt with the following people in attendance: Recorder Rita Cox, Ward 1 Councilwoman Donna Boggs, Ward 2 Councilman Bill Racer, Ward 3 Councilwoman Laurie Elkins, Ward 4 Councilman Michael Hill, Councilmen at Large Bill Javins, John Montgomery and Andy Shamblin, and City Attorney Johnnie Brown. City Treasurer John Young was absent.

INVOCATION/PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: The Invocation was given by Councilman Shamblin and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Councilwoman Boggs.

FUTURE DATES OF COUNCIL: Mayor Casebolt said the future dates of Council are September 18 and October 2 and 16.

APPROVAL OF COUNCIL MINUTES: RECORDER COX MADE THE MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF AUGUST 21 AND THE SECOND WAS BY COUNCILWOMAN BOGGS. VOTING FOR THE MOTION WERE RECORDER COX, COUNCILWOMAN BOGGS, AND COUNCILMEN RACER, HILL, JAVINS, AND MONTGOMERY. COUNCILMAN SHAMBLIN ABSTAINED AND THE MOTION CARRIED.

OLD BUSINESS

FAIRS AND FESTIVALS/CVB POSITION APPOINTMENT: RECORDER COX MADE THE MOTION THAT COUNCIL APPROVE THE HIRING OF JOE DEISS STEPHENS IN THE FAIRS AND FESTIVALS POSITION TO BE SHARED WITH THE CVB POSITION. THERE WAS A SECOND BY COUNCILMAN JAVINS. VOTING FOR THE MOTION WERE RECORDER COX, COUNCILWOMAN ELKINS, AND COUNCILMEN MONTGOMERY, JAVINS, RACER AND HILL WITH COUNCILWOMAN BOGGS ABSTAINING. THE MOTION CARRIED.

OPEN BIDS FOR CONCRETE PADS: COUNCILMAN JAVINS MADE THE MOTION THAT COUNCIL APPROVE THE BID BY HASS CONCRETE AT \$2300 PER PAD. THE SECOND WAS BY COUNCILMAN HILL. Recorder Cox said the bid by Hass was \$2300 per 10x20x6 pad. She said the bid from HLM Construction was \$3847 per pad. VOTE WAS UNANIMOUS FOR THE MOTION.

REPORT ON PAVING: COUNCILMAN JAVINS MADE THE MOTION THAT COUNCIL APPROVE \$200,000 FOR PAVING AN \$81,000 FOR CONCRETE. THERE WAS A SECOND BY COUNCILWOMAN ELKINS AND THE MOTION PASSED WITH A UNANIMOUS VOTE.

THERE WAS A SECOND BY COUNCILWOMAN ELKINS AND A UNANIMOUS VOTE FOR THE MOTION.

SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS FOR BALL FIELD AREAS: COUNCILMAN HILL MADE THE MOTION THAT SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS BE PURCHASED FOR THE PARKING LOT AND RIVERFRONT AREAS AT THE NITRO BALL PARK. COUNCILWOMAN ELKINS MADE A SECOND. VOTE WAS FOR THE MOTION.

ATTORNEY REPORT: Johnnie Brown did not have a report but said he would take questions from Council.

MAYOR COMMENTS: Mayor Casebolt reminded everyone of the upcoming Boomtown Days and Italian Festival.

COUNCIL COMMENTS: There were no comments.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Bob Schamber said the Seniors will be having events during the Boomtown Days.

ADJOURNMENT: COUNCILMAN RACER MADE THE MOTION THAT COUNCIL ADJOURN. THERE WAS A SECOND BY COUNCILMAN HILL AND THE MOTION CARRIED.

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING HOME RULE AS A PERMANENT PROGRAM

Whereas, the City of Nitro supports and requests that its Legislators and the Governor pass and sign legislation removing the sunset date in WV Code 8-1-5A and making the Home Rule Program a permanent one in West Virginia; and,

Whereas, the future economic progress for the State of West Virginia is directly tied to the success of its municipalities; and,

Whereas, the intent of the Legislature in enacting a home rule pilot program was to provide municipalities the framework in which to explore new ideas and evaluate the results to determine the viability of implementing solutions on a statewide basis and empower the municipal citizen with local control at the local level; and,

Whereas, the pilot program for municipalities in West Virginia was passed in 2007 and has proven success stories that have advanced the participating cities, thus benefitting the surrounding regions, and the entire State of WV under adoption of innovative, cost efficient and business friendly implementations of home rule ordinances, and

Whereas, the successful Legislative audit which allowed the pilot program to continue has also given the Legislature and the public an opportunity to evaluate the viability of these innovative approaches to improve urban and state development; and,

Whereas, the Home Rule Pilot Program has been used successfully in the current participating municipalities and now the City of Nitro must be given the opportunity to join should and when the governing body chooses to do so and,

Whereas, for this laboratory for democracy to continue with successful outcome, the Legislature must continue Home Rule as a permanent program. To deny passage will ultimately result in a choice of municipal winners and losers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Nitro will work with the West Virginia Municipal League to reconstitute the work of the stakeholders group representing the Fire Marshall's Office, Department of Transportation and the Department of Revenue in areas of concern that were addressed in the 2017 veto message to assure completion of the full legislative process and the continued success brought to the state through this program.

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED that the City of Nitro supports and will aggressively pursue the passage of this permanent program to allow innovative and progressive problem solving at the local level-empowering the municipal citizen and placing local control at the local level.


